


Effortless style. It's a blend of interesting architecture and smooth transitions. It's the layering of colours and textures. It's bold choices and soft features that dance in perfect harmony.

No strangers to design, the couple customized two prior homes, their taste evolving with each new project. "We are not indecisive, and we make decisions extremely quickly," says Jas. "Some may argue too quickly, but we are confident in our tastes and always go back to our first instincts, whether it's buying a chair or choosing a tile or drapery fabrics, we always go back to our first choice."

The home that caught their eye was a **Mattamy Homes** build in Oakville; a 4,000 sq. ft. model with a unique floorplan. Early in the build process, they called on friend and designer **Toula Piliouras** of **Toula Interiors**. "We worked with Toula to help guide us based on what we wanted out of this home," says Jas. "Her cabinetry designs from both an aesthetic and practical use are fantastic. She played a big role in our

family room furniture, which is something we use and appreciate daily."

Toula enhanced the design process by providing inspirational images, floor plans and helping select furnishings. Together, they narrowed the choices used in the final design. A blend of elements, including walnut finishings, mouldings and wainscotting, helped create a warm, inviting space.

The interior was customized to reflect the fresh, classic, contemporary aesthetic they were after. "Although the home was new, we wanted to ensure that it had the feeling of a space that was liveable and inviting," says Toula. "I didn't want it to scream new and untouchable, I wanted it to be sophisticated and polished but welcoming and durable."

Inside, visitors are greeted with the unique layout. Oversize entrance tiles from Ciot, tone-ontone wallpaper from **The Paint People** and a polished nickel pendant create a stylish welcome. The living room, dreamed up by Jas and Shelli, layers soft creams and greys. A tufted sofa with rolled arms, gold and marble lamps and panelling add elegance. Walls are opened with banisters to provide unfettered sightlines to the library above and the bar area below.

Step up to the library where custom, floor-to-ceiling built-ins make use of the soaring ceiling height. Hints of walnut warm the space while a chevron area rug adds dimension. The room was designed around an oversize Buddha painting, an anniversary gift from Shelli's grandmother and late grandfather.

The main level steps down to a chic bar area where argyle zebra cabinetry takes centre stage. File cabinets tuck away to allow the space to serve double duty as a bar or a home office. It's Jas's favourite space in the home. "With my technology craziness, it has everything I need from music to TV, to an additional monitor for my laptop all in one space," he says. The home's audio, visual and home automation systems were installed by Oakville Sight & Sound. "We took inspiration on the gold in the bar at the 11th hour when we were out on the town one night, and with a quick phone call to Toula asking her to change our look, she was able to make it happen."

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In the dining room, Jas and Shelli added a striking arabesque ceiling detail painted in burnished gold. An area rug and artwork from **Andersons** and lighting from **Gerrie Electric** tie into the metallic elements. The window is swathed in soft fabric panels from **The Drape Lady**. A rich dining table flanked by cream chairs from **Sterling House Interiors** softens the space.

Thoughtful elements create cohesiveness throughout. Additional lighting from Union Lighting adds structure and style. Hand-scraped white oak flooring in Baroque from **Modern Flooring** adds warmth, while Berber carpeting softens the stairwell and bedrooms.

The kitchen is one of Shelli's favourite spots. "Family and friends think I'm absolutely crazy having glass fridges, but

I love organizing and keeping the fridges tidy and visually appealing, and especially showcasing our family's healthy eating habits and love for nutritious foods." Light and airy, white cabinetry by **Landmark Kitchen Concepts** is complemented by a maple island and polished chrome drawers. Statuario quartz countertops add sophistication, as does a band of chrome to highlight the elegant range hood.

The kitchen opens to the family room, where a waffle ceiling draws the eye upward. A cast-stone fireplace is flanked by warm walnut built-ins. A geometric rug adds texture, while furnishings from **Gresham House Furniture** provide a cosy place for the family to relax. Just off the hallway, the mudroom provides an organized place for the family to come and go. Continued on page 34
